DOG AWARENESS

Recently I participated in a Dog Walk at Balboa park, there were about 250 letter carriers, clerks and management personnel along with their families. The purpose of this Dog Walk was to make the public aware of the danger that their dogs pose to letter carriers. Last year letter carriers from the Van Nuys cluster suffered 85 dog bites, the most of any district in the country. There were 3,138 letter carriers nationwide bitten by dogs last year. The dog walk received good local press coverage, I hope the customers that we deliver mail to got the message and will do more to restrain and keep their dogs under control. I would like to thank all of the employees of the Postal Service who came out to help us get this very important message out to the public. I would like to also thank Fernando Miranda and Nestor Rivera for helping me grill hamburgers and hotdogs.

NOTIFICATION TO INCREASE UNION DUES

This is notification that the question of increasing the union dues of all active members will be before the membership and voted on at the September regular branch meeting to be held on Tuesday September 3, 2002.

A by-law change was passed at the July meeting, regarding increasing the union dues of all active letter carriers that are members of Branch 2462.

This by-law were submitted at the June meeting and voted upon at the July meeting as per Article XV of the Branch by-laws.

Article 7, Section 2 of the NALC Constitution states the following:

The rates of dues and initiation fees may be increased only by majority vote by secret ballot of the regular members in good standing at a special or regular meeting after reasonable notice has been given that this question will be before the meeting. Except that a branch may provide in its by-laws that such majority vote may be had by secret ballot referendum...

Therefore, the above is to be considered reasonable notification as per the NALC Constitution.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT By Art Bocek

MSP Scans

Recently I have learned though various sources that a letter carrier in the valley has been placed on an "Emergency Suspension without Pay" under Art 16, Section 7. You ask, "What dastardly deed did this individual do? Well, this person believed they could have scan points on a personal piece of paper and scan them when it was time for the scan and not be at the scan point. As you can tell, management took a dim view of this and issued the "Emergency Suspension". Currently, this individual has been in a non-pay status for about 3 weeks while management gets all of their ducks in a row in order to determine whether or not to issue a "Notice of Removal". Well, I ask you, was running the route and be somewhere else worth it? You decide.

Leave without Pay

An Employee may request unpaid time off ---leave without pay (LWOP) --- by submitting a Form 3971. If the requested LWOP is for more than 30 days, the applicant contain a written statement giving the reason for the requested LWOP absence (ELM Section 514.51).

A general rule, management may grant LWOP as matter of administration discretion. There are certain exceptions concerning disabled veterans, military reservist, and members of the National Guard (ELM Section 514.22). A national Memorandum of Understanding establishes that an employee need not exhaust annual leave and/ or sick leave before requesting LWOP (ELM Section 514.4d).

OWCP/Fraud

It has come to my attention through various sources that carriers who have suffered an "On the Job Injuries" are aggressively being followed by your friends and mine, the "Postal Inspectors". What the Postal Inspection Service is currently doing is following you all day long watching and filming. The Postal Service has even gone so far as to send injured employees free tickets to local amusement parks in a covert manner, in order to get a great video background of the injured employee. This 10-12 hour film is then reduced to 30 minutes of prime time viewing in order to see if you are performing any acts in violation of your medical restrictions. The Postal Service then takes action to have you removed for fraud. So when your medical restrictions have changed for either the better or worse, you need to notify the Postal Service in order not to find yourself with this problem.

Remember, "The more rights you know, the less you will bleed from management"

Summertime Fun!! Play It Safe!!

Hi Brothers and Sisters,

By the time you receive this safety message summer will have already started. So this is just a reminder to play it safe this summer. There are some things to keep in mind during the summer months:

- 1. The use of sunscreen---Sunscreen is the quickest and easiest thing you can do to decrease your risk of skin cancer. Most Letter Carriers are out on the street between the hours of 10 am and 3 pm. This is when the sun's rays are the most intense.
- Studies have been done which show that children are even more sensitive to the sun because they have thinner skin than adults. About 70 percent of skin damage occurs before the age of 18.

It is recommended that you use a sunscreen with an SPF (sun protection factor) of 15 or higher. It should provide both UVA and UVB protection.

Water Safety

- Never leave a child alone, especially around water. A child can drown in less than an inch of water.
- Never take our eyes off a child around water. Even a trip to answer the phone, or turn down the stove, etc., can be disastrous.
- 3. Drain and store plastic wading pools on their sides after each use.
- 4. Enclose permanent pools with a fence that is at least 4 feet high, and keep the gates locked.

Every parent should learn and become proficient at infant and child CPR.


