PRESIDENT'S REPORT By Calvin Brookins

Postal Automated Redirection System (PARS)

PARS is a system to identify "Undeliverable as Address" (UAA) letter mail at the first machine handling within the Postal Service and redirect it automatically to the current and correct destination.

PARS will automate the handling of Change of Address (COA) forms/3575; Carrier Change of Address Cards/3982; Notification of Mailer/3547; Address Correct Services; and Forwarded Mail – UAA due to a move.

The Postal Service expects to save 2.8 million work hours in phase 1 of the process (64% in CFS units, 30% in clerk delivery functions, 4% in city and rural carrier functions and the remaining 2% in P&DC operations).

The USPS in Van Nuys District has initiated a new process to handle forwardable undeliverable as address mail. Management has started to get some information out to the workroom floor, however I do not believe that all carriers fully understand this new process. In most of the stations management have carriers placing mail into trays that have been identified as FOE, Attempted Not Known, No Such Number, etc. That is the first part of the prep to get this mail ready to run through the machine, once it gets to the plant they will further prep this mail and break it down as return to sender mail such as No Such Number, Attempted Not Known, Insufficient Address and Vacants all of this mail must be identified with a special separation card. It will also identify carrier identified forwards, that is the mail that you as a carrier identifies as a forward and send it to CFS.

The machine is also equipped to intercept forward-able mail, the way this works is once CFS receives the Change ofAddress card the card will then be scanned, the information stored in USPS automation equipment, and all read-able/machinable letter mail will be printed, barcoded and sent directly to the new address without delay. The carrier will not receive the Change of Address card back you will only get a sticker that you will then place on the new PS Form 3982-X, this sticker will have no mention of the new address.

Security and Sanctity of the Mails

The security and sanctity of the mails is absolute. This absolute trust is given to all USPS employees and must be guarded and revered by all employees entrusted with the trust. This includes both the mails and property of the Postal Service. If you violate this "absolute trust", "its absolute you will be terminated." Now consider this, by violating the "Security and Sanctity of the Mails" you also have violated both 18 U.S.C. 1707 and 18 U.S.C. 1709, whereby, you not only can be fined but also criminally prosecuted and sent to prison. So ask yourself this question "is it worth violating the security and sanctity of the mails by taking something not yours, therefore, loosing your job, career and possibly do time? (PS, you could work with "Bubba" in the prison mail room!)

Street Management, M-39, Section 134.1

According to section 134 of M-39, street management is a "natural extension" of office management. All carriers are to be notified to expect daily supervision on the street just as they receive daily supervision in the office. For a delivery manager to fully understand and control the organization, the manager must be aware of any condition that affect delivery anywhere within the service territory. Accompanying carriers on the street is considered essential responsibility and most important duties. Management should act promptly to correct improper conditions. A positive attitude must be maintained by the manger at all times.

In section 134.2 og M-39, <u>management must maintain an objective attitude</u> in conducting street supervision and discharge this duty in an open and above board manner. Management is <u>not to spy, or use covert techniques</u>. Any employee infractions are to be handled in accordance with the section in the current National Agreement that deal with the problem.

The PARS program should be nationwide by 2006. The postal service handles 6 billion undeliverable as addressed mail pieces each year and over 44 million moves per year (16% of the US population) at a cost of \$1.8 billion per year. The new PARS program will attempt to automate the

process.
