It was not long ago when mail volume and parcels dropped to levels where are routes took on adds while routes were eliminated and attrition of carriers was not being replaced and our membership declined. We should all be thankful for our being able to take advantage of the e-commerce boom and thus increased parcel business. The Postal Service's ability to become profitable on the backs of letter carrier's has given our union the ability to have more skin in the game and enhance their ability to negotiate a contract or go to arbitration with the tools necessary to get a good one. Before 1970, letter carriers had to beg for a raise to Congress. After letter carriers went on strike that year ,crippling the Service, we won the right to collectively bargain our contract or get one through the arbitration procedure. Over 46 years later, we are still fighting for a contract that rewards letter carriers for their hard work dedication and contributions. For that, we all should be thankful

Through the years, our union has negotiated a 40 hour work week, 10 paid holidays, 26 paid vacation days after 15 years of service and 13 sick days a year. Also, our union has been able to negotiate health benefits, life insurance, a pension and a 401k matching program. We receive overtime after 8 hours and double time after 10 hours except in December. We have received wage increases and COLA increases in every contract and have never had our wages and/or benefits reduced. Our union dues pay for many things at the National, State and local levels and our elected union officials are working hard each and every day to preserve what we have and continue to fight for our rights at all 3 levels. For this, we should all be thankful! Why? Because, with the stroke of a pen, Congress can take all or part of it away and this is why it is so important to elect labor friendly candidates during election season to ensure we have them watching our backs on Capitol Hill

I would like the membership to know our routes are longer due to increased political mail, coverages and parcels but remember this is job security and as long as the Postal Service is in good financial health, we will have a job as long as

we want one.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all of the members of Branch 2462 for their support of me as your appointed Vice-President these past 2 years! It has been an honor and a privilege serving all of you. I would also like to wish all of you and your families a happy and healthy holiday season.


