PRESIDENT'S REPORT By JANETTE DOLABSON

USPS Delivery Initiative

On July 16, 2020, USPS notified NALC of the ESAS test that was scheduled to begin on July 25 in approximately 400 test sites. On July 28, USPS provided us with revised guidelines for the test. The ESAS initiative substantially alters delivery practices and procedures outlined in the Handbooks M-39 and M-41. These changes directly impact terms and conditions of employment of city letter carriers in violation of Article 19 of the National Agreement.

The ESAS test imposes restrictions on letter carriers' morning casing duties which conflict with M-39 Section 121.211. Similarly, the ESAS test prevents carriers from withdrawing mail in violation of M-41 Section 223.11. Additionally, letter carriers do not obtain accountable items until after they have pulled the mail from the case in violation of M-41 Section 262.1.

The ESAS test raises the same fundamental interpretive issue that NALC has raised in previous national level disputes: whether the Postal Service may suspend compliance with the National Agreement or applicable regulations under the guise of conducting a "test." It remains our position that management may not unilaterally implement tests which are inconsistent with regulations outlined in handbooks and manuals without first reaching an agreement with the Union.

NALC has requested a meeting with the Postal Service to discuss this interpretive dispute. PR

COVID-19 and the USPS Stimulus Relief

As letter carriers on the front lines of serving 160 million Americans and businesses every day, you know that the Covid-19 pandemic is something we have never experienced before. While our letter carriers show their resilience, strength, and continued service to the public

every day, the Postal Service looms closer to shuttering due to the staggering loss in mail volume and revenue during this crisis. It's a desperate situation that only Congress and the Administration can help solve.

We cannot allow the USPS to fail.

Unfortunately, instead of providing much needed immediate financial assistance urged by NALC and stakeholders, the last stimulus gave the Postal Service a slap in the face by giving it access to a conditional line of credit. Those conditions are not new to letter carriers - as they seek to destroy the network and attack letter carriers at the behest of private shippers. This is not a solution. It is a way to weaken the Postal Service by riddling it with more debt to the point where opponents of the constitutionally mandated service will destroy it.

While it has been 40 years since we have needed taxpayer funding, we need financial relief to continue to serve this country through this crisis - and we need it now. Thankfully, the American public is on our side. A recent bipartisan poll showed that 92 percent of voters support direct funding for the Postal Service in the next pandemic response bill.

VICE PRESIDENT' REPORT By JOHN BURTON

Once again the "Dog Days of Summer" have descended on Southern California, and while we have all suffered through this many times, it does not hurt to be reminded again of the dangers of heat exposure.

Working outside, and in vehicles, in the heat can pose many threats. A parked vehicle sitting in the sun with an outside temperature of 85 degrees, will rise to an internal temperature of 114 degrees in 20 minutes, and 124 degrees in 60 minutes. At 95, not uncommon in our area, those temps rise to 126 in 20 minutes and 138 in 60 minutes.

Effects of heat related illnesses can begin to present when the body temperature rises above 102 degrees. This does not take long when working in the above described conditions.

Protecting Workers from Heat Stress Heat Illness

Exposure to heat can cause illness and death. The most serious heat illness is heat stroke. Other heat illnesses, such as heat exhaustion, heat cramps and heat rash, should also be avoided.

There are precautions your employer should take any time temperatures are high and the job involves physical work. Risk Factors for Heat Illness • High temperature and humidity, direct sun exposure, no breeze or wind • Low liquid intake • Heavy physical labor • Waterproof clothing • No recent exposure to hot workplaces Symptoms of Heat Exhaustion • Headache, dizziness, or fainting • Weakness and wet skin • Irritability or confusion • Thirst, nausea, or vomiting

Symptoms of Heat Stroke • May be confused, unable to think clearly, pass out, collapse, or have seizures (fits) • May stop sweating.

To Prevent Heat Illness, your Employer Should • Establish a complete heat illness prevention program.

• Provide training about the hazards leading to heat stress and how to prevent them. • Provide a lot of cool water to workers close to the work area. At least one pint of water per hour is needed.


Remember in end it is your responsibility to watch out and be aware of what is going on in your body. Do not wait until you are experiencing the above symptoms. The best preventative is hydration, WATER. Just that plain and simple, drink water before, during and after exposure to outside temperatures. Do not wait until you are thirsty, by then it is probably too late. Be safe and aware, your life could depend on it.

POST OFFICE FACES MAJOR ASSAULT STEVE SEYFRIED

Well it didn't take very long for the true purpose of our new Postmaster General to raise its ugly head. We all feared what the elimination of Overtime, Cut back in Service and all the other "cost saving measures" that he has recently implemented would do. With these actions and the emanations coming from the White House, it is now quite apparent that the true purpose of all of this is to cripple the USPS, at a time when the people of our country need it the most. Covid-19 is ravaging the country, except evidently not in the White House or the U.S. Senate. People are afraid, as they should be. Cases have topped 5 million in the US, the highest in the world. Our number of deaths is over

160,000 in 6 months, and we are instructed to wear masks and stay at home to protect ourselves and others.
